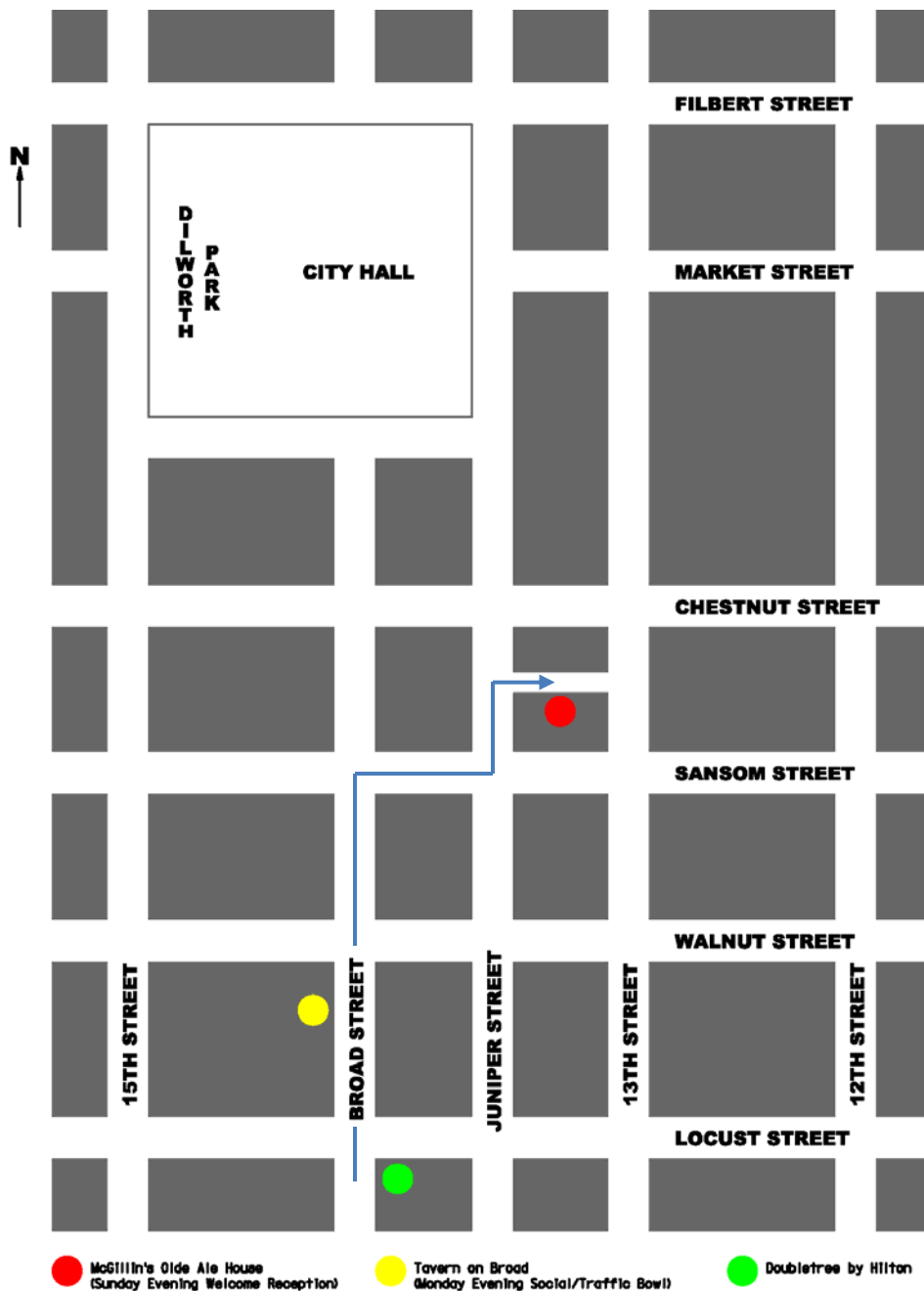

CONFERENCE LOCATION PHILADELPHIA, PENNSYLVANIA



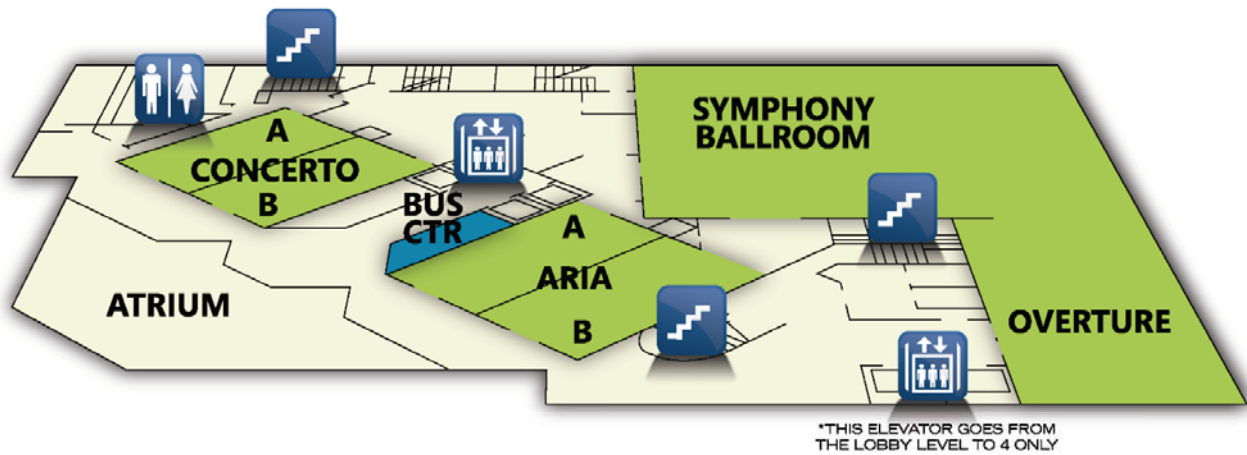

GETTING AROUND PHILADELPHIA

Philadelphia is a dense and walkable City. Most attractions are within one mile of the conference venue. Philadelphia has a great and robust transit system offered by SEPTA (www.septa.org). The conference is located adjacent to the Walnut-Locust stop on Broad Street Subway Line and within walking distance of the Market-Frankford Subway Line and Subway-Surface Trolley Lines. The two lines converge at City Hall. There are also nearby and frequent bus services. Philadelphia is a bicycle friendly city and is served by the popular bicycle sharing system Indego (www.rideindego.com). Please take advantage of the discounted Indego daily passes available at the registration desk. The City is also easy to navigate using cabs, Uber, and Lyft.

MONDAY KEYNOTE SPEAKER

Mark Squilla
City Council of Philadelphia
First District



Mark Squilla represents City Council’s First District, a diverse and growing area that stretches along the Delaware River from his native South Philadelphia across Center City, Chinatown, Northern Liberties, Fishtown, Kensington and Port Richmond.

A graduate of St. John Neumann High School (1980) and LaSalle University (1985) with a Bachelor of Arts degree in Computer Science, Councilman Squilla was first elected to office in 2011. However his life in public service began nearly two decades earlier, when he brought his Whitman neighbors together to save their local park, Burke Playground.

Councilman Squilla’s experiences as a Community organizer, public servant, husband and father have taught him that strong families and engaged neighborhoods are the key to Philadelphia’s future. As the city grows and evolves, Councilman Squilla believes that bringing together the best of each community’s traditions and new life is crucial to Philadelphia’s success, block by block and group by group. He has shown his commitment to this belief by immersing himself into efforts like the move toward revitalizing the Reading Viaduct and the planning work of the Central Delaware Advisory Group, to the ongoing growth and challenges of the East Passyunk Business Improvement District, which has become one of the East Coast’s most prominent emerging hotspots for living, dining and nightlife.

The Chair of Council’s Streets Committee, Councilman Squilla is also a member of the Committees on Rules, Finance, Licenses and Inspections, Public Property and Public Works, Transportation and Public Utilities, Education, Global Opportunities and the Creative/Innovative Economy, and Technology and Information Services. Given its presence in the First District, he is likewise an *ex officio* member of the Board of Directors of the Pennsylvania Convention Center Authority and a member of the Delaware Valley Regional Planning Commission and the Reading Terminal Market Board of Directors. He also serves as a Board member for The Cultural Fund, Fleisher Art School, Avenue of the Arts and Historic Philadelphia.

Jeffrey D. Knuettel is the tenth General Manager to serve the Southeastern Pennsylvania Transportation Authority (SEPTA). Over the course of his almost 30-year career at SEPTA, he has concentrated on improving the reliability, attractiveness, and efficiency of transit services by transforming design, construction, and maintenance processes, and enhancing operations.

As GM he is committed to concentrating on customer satisfaction, employee development, safety, investment in infrastructure and vehicles, and business innovation to focus SEPTA on Building the Future – one that is strong for the region, riders, and employees. Jeff holds undergraduate and graduate degrees in Civil Engineering from the Cooper Union for the Advancement of Science and Art in New York, and he is a registered Professional Engineer in the Commonwealth of Pennsylvania. Combining his educational background and professional experience, Jeff excels in the strategic management of capital resources. He also has a steadfast commitment to safety. Under his leadership the Authority now has two strong outreach programs – Make the Safe Choice – for customers and Never Too Busy for Safety – for employees; and completed the work to install Positive Train Control (PTC) across its Regional Rail network before the federal mandate deadline.

He sits on the Board of Directors of APTA, the Transportation Learning Center, and the Advisory Board of the Railroad Engineering and Safety Program at the University of Delaware, and he is a member of ASCE, AREMA, COMTO, and WTS. Jeff is the recipient of the 2015 WTS Philadelphia Award recipient and he was honored by the ASCE Philadelphia with the 2015 Civil Engineer of the Year Award.

Instilled with a strong belief in the importance of service to the community, for more than a decade, Jeff has worked with the Philadelphia March of Dimes Transportation Building & Construction Awards Luncheon serving as Chair and Honorary Chair for this event. He is also now contributing his service to address the challenges of homelessness in Philadelphia and the region and was instrumental in establishing the partnership between SEPTA, the City of Philadelphia, and Project Home to construct a new Hub of Hope homeless engagement center.

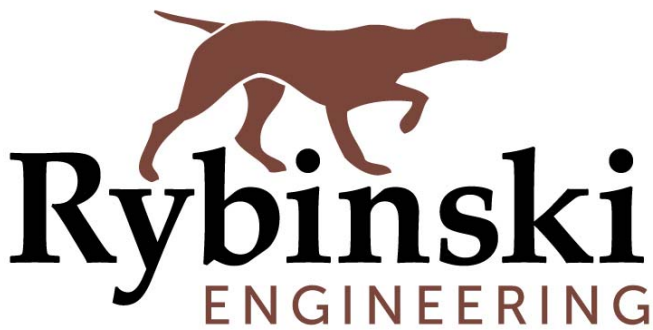

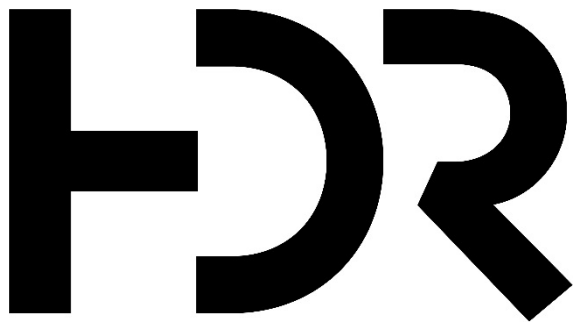
