Join us for the Women's Breakfast in Ballroom A, with Pamela Brown, Ph.D, Executive Director of the Anne Arundel County Partnership for Children, Youth, and Families. Dr. Brown has held several leadership positions over the past 30 years in government and in the not-for-profit sector. Throughout her career, she has worked on addressing inequities across government and educational systems. She holds her Ph.D. in Educational Leadership at Florida Atlantic University. Her dissertation focused on the importance of community partnerships in low income neighborhoods to improve outcomes for children and families.

This presentation will take the audience on a virtual data tour of Anne Arundel County, the host site, to make the case that understanding where the need for mobility is highest can help decrease poverty within low-income neighborhoods. Participants will learn of how one suburban county used local community data to encourage partnerships among transportation, public works, health and human services agencies, and residents to increase economic mobility for the most under-resourced communities. Dr. Brown also serves as an appointed member of the X commission, a role she has held for eight years.




