




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### **Anne Arundel County Hispanic Population and Country of Origin, 2023**

- Hispanic population growing more significantly than all races/ethnicities and is now at 10.7%
- The county has the fourth largest Hispanic population by percentage among Maryland counties. I.
- Largest sector of the Hispanic population is from Central American countries, including a growing population from El Salvador. This is significantly different from the overall U.S. Hispanic population, which is overwhelmingly Mexican (63%)
- Traditional governmental systems struggling to adequately respond to this growing Spanish-speaking population but there has been some progress.

### **The Economy**

- Third largest jurisdiction in the state, third largest economy at \$64.3 billion
- There are 66,000 businesses within county boundaries
- In 2025 the county retained its AAA from S&P Global Ratings and its Aa1 from Moody's Investors Service
- The most recent household median income estimates stand at \$116,548
- In April 2025, Anne Arundel County home prices were up 3.4% compared to last year, selling for a median price of \$476K
- In March, 2025, the unemployment rate was down to a low of 2.5 percent
- · We continue to have a labor shortage in most sectors



### County Unemployment. 2016 - 2024




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### A Place to Live – Homeowners and Renters

- 74.3% of County residents are homeowners
- · Renters account for 25.7% of residents
- 47 percent of county renters spend over 30 percent of their income on their rent, which classifies them as rent overburdened.
- Average rent \$2,000 for a 1 bedroom
- Decreasing amount of public and subsidized housing in the county.
- There are 18453 families on waiting list for housing vouchers








### The Social Determinants of Health (SDOH)


'The conditions in the environments where people are born, live, learn, work, play, worship, and age that affect a wide range of health, functioning, and quality-of-life outcomes and risks.'

- Economic distress and rising social determinants of health spread unequally throughout the county
- Pockets of low income and poverty-level families clustered in North and South County areas, parts of Annapolis, and the Meade/Severn area of West County.
- These areas are disproportionately African American and Hispanic, pointing to a geography and color to county poverty.



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
### Just the Food Facts ...


- There are over 51,000 food insecure people in Anne Arundel County
- 11,072 households receive SNAP benefits
- Approximately 75,000 county residents live in a food desert
- There are 17 census tracts which are considered food deserts in Anne Arundel County located in Glen Burnie, Brooklyn Park, Linthicum Heights, Eastport, Fort Meade, Jessup and Severn
- In 2024, 45.4 percent of Anne Arundel County children received free and reduced meals
- 16,290 food insecure children
- Child insecurity rate: 14% African American, 10% Hispanic, 8.9 Percent White





### **Gun Violence**




- 2016 2019, a total of 594 injuries due to firearms in Anne Arundel County
- Black males had 11 times the rate of firearm injury compared to White males
- · Hispanic males had the second highest injury rate



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### **Children and Families Living in our Communities of Hope**

- Disproportionately African American and growing Hispanic
- Low income, very low income, living in poverty
- Impacted by Adverse Community Environments often caused by historical and systemic racism
- Suffer from health disparities: low birth weight, environmental issues including asthma, diabetes, heart disease
- Food access issues
- Rent overburdened
- Lack of transportation
- Many economic and racial disparities



### **Three Big Needs Unchanged Since 2009**

### **Transportation**

The majority of county residents (66 percent) drive to work alone in their cars every day; 7 percent car pool; 2 percent walk; and 1 percent take public transportation, 23% worked at home (2021)

### **Affordable Housing**

The average rent for a two-bedroom apartment in the county is \$1,658 per month. Affordable housing is non-existent in most parts of the county creating stress, and worst of all homelessness, for low income families

### Affordable, Quality, Child Care


The average cost of family daycare for two children is over \$25,000 per year, more for a child care center

- On-Demand paratransit (documented disability) and elderly (55 and over) transport





All Transit Routes are Fare Free








### **Brooklyn Park Data**

- The median income for the area is \$49,171, under half of the county average median income of \$103,255 (US Census American Community Survey, 2022).
- Poverty rate is 25.1 percent; five times the poverty rate of Anne Arundel County.
- Child poverty is 35 percent. (US Census American Community Survey, 2022).
- Brooklyn Park has at least six rising socio-economic indicators of need:
- ✓ Percent of families living at or below poverty
- ✓ Percent of the population without a high school diploma
- ✓ Percent of households receiving food stamps (SNAP)
- ✓ Emergency department visit rate
- √ Percent of low income households
- ✓ Percent of low income housing
- ✓ Percent of low birth weight infants
- ✓ Preventable hospitalization rate
- ✓ Disproportionately African American
- ✓ Preterm births



### **Brooklyn Park Mobility Study, 2021**

First mobility-focused study centering on the neighborhood of Brooklyn Park. Partners included:

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### **Community Voices**

# Heard from the Community

- Grocery stores are too far away for walking or biking. Save-A-Lot does not carry everything but is the only option accessible within the neighborhood.
- Improve pedestrian access to local markets.

### Heard from the Community

- It's not a comfortable place to walk along Ritchie Highway. Its loud, and large trucks and cars drive fast.
- I can't ride my bike on the street and there isn't enough space on the sidewalk.
- It's hard to get to the store without a car.
- Cars don't really see you when you are crossing the street even in crosswalks

### **Heard From the Community**

- Improve sidewalk maintenance, including crumbled, narrow sidewalks and worn crosswalk paint.
- Build a trail connection to schools.
- Provide more bus options to neighborhood schools.
- Improve overall conditions for walking, biking, and taking the bus to school. Residents feel driving is the only safe option.
- Increase the amount of crossing guards.
